

FAQ Summer Camp

The daily schedule will be like this:

The participants will be divided into 3 different groups for the workshops. The intention is to have groups of participants that more or less match each others qualifications and experience. We expect approx. 15 participants per group. All groups will meet all main subject teachers every day through Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Wednesday the workshops will be taught by high estimated guest teachers. The conductors will get a chance to conduct in Jespers and Jims classes, where the team participants and students from RAMA are forming a vocal ensemble. Thursday there might be an opportunity to conduct the vocal ensemble DOPPLERS in Jespers class, if we get participants enough for the summer camp.

The material, sheets etc. is included in the price.

The "Special Program" is for existing choirs and ensembles that want to join the Summer Camp on the side. They will get 4 x 45 min. coaching per day and will join the morning and evening sessions.
